Killing Vincent

On July 27, 1890, Vincent van Gogh came stumbling into his room in the Ravoux Inn, in Auvers-sur-Oise, France, bleeding from a wound in his abdomen. Thirty hours later, Vincent was dead. The common myth, which has prevailed for over one-hundred years, is that the “mad” artist shot himself in a wheat field after suffering from years of unhappiness and “insanity.” But is that what really happened?

ABOUT THE PRESENTER: Dr. Arenberg has studied and written about Vincent for over thirty years, and he never believed the nineteenth-century legend that the artist committed suicide. Now, he puts forth a different side of the story, one bolstered by new, twenty-first century forensic evidence. In *Killing Vincent: The Man, The Myth, and The Murder*, Arenberg strips back the layers of misunderstanding surrounding Vincent's final days in an attempt to determine once and for all if the painter really shot himself - or if he was murdered.
